Nicaragua reiterates commitment to a world free of nuclear weapons and weapons of mass destruction

On the 78th anniversary of the atomic bombings of the cities of Nagasaki and Hiroshima, the Government of Nicaragua proclaimed its support for a world free of nuclear weapons and weapons of mass destruction, said Vice President Rosario Murillo.

"One more anniversary of the criminal atomic bombings on Hiroshima on August 6th and Nagasaki today. First of all, we want to express our condemnation, reiterate our condemnation of that genocidal use of bombs in a peaceful area, in this case two towns, but not only there, anywhere in the world, when we see those frightful documentaries about the war in Vietnam and how they wanted to leave scorched earth, exfoliate everything, the forests, change the topography, bombing with prohibited substances [that fell] on the people themselves, children, youth, adolescents, elderly people in that heroic Vietnam, a thousand times heroic that defeated the invasion," said the Vice President.

"Seventy-eight years ago, the first atomic bombing was conducted and at what cost. By the end of 1945, the bombs had killed an estimated 166,000 brothers and sisters in Hiroshima and 80,000 in Nagasaki. It is calculated 246 thousand dead; it must be more. That is why our Nicaragua has always expressed its opposition to the use of weapons of mass destruction. And in these times, the weapons of mass destruction are not only those that kill, that sow destruction, that sow pain, suffering, death, but also communication is used as a weapon of mass destruction to destroy countries, to sow lies about their heroic history, to misinform, to destroy reputations, to destroy entire families, communication as a weapon of mass destruction, yet another invention of the empires", she added.

Conference highlights Comandante Chávez's integrationist legacy

"Chávez and Latin American and Caribbean integration" was the title of the Lecture delivered by Professor Adán Chávez Frías, President of the Institute of Advanced Studies of the Thought of Hugo Chávez. Professor Chavez Frías is a politician and university professor of vast trajectory. This space for academic reflection was organized by the Miguel Escoto Brockmann House of Sovereignty of the UNAN-Managua.

The Conference highlighted the relevance of the thought of Commander Hugo Chávez, which is evident in the advances achieved in integration throughout the region that have contributed to the political, economic, and social development of the peoples of Latin America and the Caribbean, in a context of struggle against imperialist hegemony.

The professor highlighted that the integration project of Commander Chávez has its roots in the historical legacy of such great leaders as Simón Bolívar, José Martí and Fidel Castro, who sowed the foundations for the independence of their peoples, rescuing the cosmovision and revolutionary actions and ideals that were consolidated with the Bolivarian Alliance for the Peoples of Our America (ALBA).

Likewise, he said that at present revolutionary peoples such as Cuba, Venezuela and Nicaragua are an example of resistance to a hegemonic model that seeks subjugation through coups d'état, blockades-sanctions, strategies of economic and political destabilization. He also recalled the historic milestone of the civic-military insurgency of 1992 led by Commander Chávez to initiate processes of change and integration with brotherly peoples.

First Livestock Fair Managua 2023 inaugurated

With a ribbon cutting ceremony, the First Livestock Fair Managua 2023 was officially inaugurated, thanks to the impetus of the Government of Nicaragua through the institutions of the National System of Production, Consumption and Commerce, in conjunction with producers and breeders of livestock genetics.

Bosco Castillo, Minister of Agriculture and Livestock, considered that this is one of the largest fairs ever held in Nicaragua, with the participation of more than 30 cattle ranches.

"The best cattle ranches we have in the country, all the possible breeds have been brought here; we must recognize the effort of the comrades who are in the Organizing Committee, but beyond that, the effort of our President (Daniel Ortega), and Compañera Rosario, who are the ones directing all this support framework for the National Production, Consumption and Commerce System", he valued.

Referring to the First Livestock Fair Managua 2023, Bosco assured that this is an effort that will help improve the genetics of the country's livestock, "a little bit of what we have been doing over time".

Nicaragua launches Citizen and Human Security Plan

The National Police, in coordination with United Firefighters, presented this Wednesday, 9 August, the Citizen and Human Security Plan - Encounters with Families and Communities, to be carried out from 11 August to 7 November 2023.

From the Faustino Ruiz Police Complex, Inspector General Jaime Antonio Vanegas explained that the objective of these encounters or meetings is to strengthen the work carried out by the Buen Gobierno to protect the lives of Nicaraguans and maintain the safety of individuals, families, and communities, to reduce the danger of crime, prevent fires and prevent traffic accidents with fatalities.

Nicaragua: Cordoba to US dollar exchange rate to be 0% by 2024

The Central Bank of Nicaragua (BCN) informs that its Board of Directors decided to establish a sliding rate of the exchange rate of the Cordoba against the US Dollar at zero percent (0%) per annum, as of January 1, 2024.

The table of the daily Official Exchange Rate published in the BCN's web page remains in effect until December 31, 2023.

This decision is adopted four months in advance in order to provide greater exchange rate predictability, as well as to facilitate the State's budget formulation, the NCB's monetary programming and business planning.

The measure is adopted within a framework of appropriate macroeconomic policies and macro-financial indicators, and because recent economic developments show the following results: (i) economic activity growing, (ii) consolidated public finances, (iii) financed balance of payments, (iv) stable financial system, (v) growing international reserves, and (v) monetary and exchange rate stability.
