Ebrahim Raisi: A new world order, in favor of resistant countries

During the closing ceremony of the official visit of the delegation of the Islamic Republic of Iran to Nicaragua, headed by President Ebrahim Raisi, [the Iranian leader] affirmed that Unity and Integration among Latin American countries with other regions of the world would help both to consolidate integration and neutralize [the impact of] sanctions.

"In the name of God, may the peace of God be upon his Prophet Muhammad, may peace be upon him and his family. I am very happy to be here today in Latin America and in the brotherly country Nicaragua. I appreciate the invitation of His Excellency President Daniel Ortega and I also thank him for his invitation and my greetings and respect to the heroic and warm-hearted people of Nicaragua and I pay my homage and respect to the national heroes of Latin America, especially Nicaragua," he said.

The Iranian president said that in the Foreign Policy of the Islamic Republic of Iran, maintaining relations with independent countries have always been a central policy" and it is in this same spirit that my visit here to Latin America, to the Independent Countries of the Region has been carried out".

A New World Order, in favor of the countries that resist

Raisi stressed that a new world order will undoubtedly be established in favor of the resilient and independent countries, stressing "the relationship between independent countries and the importance of taking advantage of our mutual capabilities."

Likewise, he considered that Unity and Integration among Latin American countries with other regions of the world, would help both to consolidate integration and neutralize sanctions.

Dr. Jamileh Alamolhoda: After the Revolution, the situation of women changed completely in Iran

Dr. Jamileh Alamolhoda, First Lady of the Islamic Republic of Iran, during her visit to Nicaragua, was interviewed by Channel 4's *Revista en Vivo*, where she highlighted the role and importance that Iranian women have regained thanks to the Revolution.

"In the name of God I send greetings to you and to the people who are present here, in your program. Rather than talk about myself, I prefer to talk about the Iranian women of my country. At the time of the Revolution, I was a 12 year old girl. Together with my mother we watched the Revolution and we participated in the demonstrations. I remember all the situations and conditions that we went through during the Islamic Revolution and all the streets and the history," she recalled.

She noted that "before the Revolution Iranian women were showing themselves as some people, a beautiful human being, but weak, like the States of different countries were portraying to the world. At the time, women had two roles in the Revolution, women who stayed in the house and respected the family and women who wanted to leave the house and be in the social world and did not respect the family".

"And women who were revolutionaries would criticize and were upset with the dictatorship, then the Revolution caused women to be ahead of the Revolution in our country. Then Imam Khomeini gave women a very good point of view and showed that women can be influential in the Revolution and in the country," she said.

She stated that "Iranian men were more enthusiastic when they saw that women were engaged in the Revolution, they were in the streets, in order to protect the Revolution and to protect the family. They were together. After the Islamic Revolution we had a war with Iraq, where women fought side by side with the men. I grew up in that situation. For that reason, I like it and it is something philosophical. The family in our thinking is not about status, it is something very familiar and the importance of the family is very different to us".

On Thursday, June 15th, the Miguel d'Escoto Brockmann House of Sovereignty presented the first issue of the Magazine *Soberanía*, dedicated to the figure of Sandino as maximum proponent in defense of national sovereignty and dignity, in honor of General Augusto C. Sandino.

Academics, students, collaborators and special guests participated in this event, both in person and virtually. The Magazine was introduced by Dr. Luis Alfredo Lobo, Vice Rector General of UNAN-Managua, who said that the issues will be published monthly in a digital format. This first edition explores in depth the life and work of the general of free men and women.

According to Lobato, the Magazine is an element for dissemination of fundamental ideas and love for the people, and it is not aimed at a specific academic field. The articles will be presented in a way that is accessible and understandable to the general public.

Dr. Luis Alfredo Lobato Blanco mentioned that this first issue has articles by the authors Carlos Emilio López Hurtado, Freddy Franco, Pedro César Batista, Edgar Palazio Galo and Luis Varese, among others. It also contains comments on a biography of Sandino [by Gregorio Selser], an interview and analysis of current events.

Lobato also said that this work is intended to include contributions from academics who have collaborated in multiple publications highlighting the issues relating to sovereignty, self-determination, multilateralism, and social justice.
