Dr. Herman Van de Velde stresses the importance of genuine cooperation in the development of the peoples of our Americas

On Thursday, 28 September, the Miguel d'Escoto Brockmann House of Sovereignty held the second meeting of the Forum on Genuine Cooperation, addressing on this occasion "The necessary relationship between Sovereignty and Genuine Cooperation", delivered by Dr. Herman Van de Velde, coordinator of ÁBACOenRed.

During the forum, Dr. Van de Velde pointed out that the concept of sovereignty is associated with key words such as anti-imperialism, self-determination, solidarity interdependence, decolonization, identity, and nationalization, which are linked to its social practice. For Van de Velde, to speak of genuine cooperation implies working together to build a society based on active participation, dialogue, and integration.

He also stated that genuine cooperation is focused on creating spaces for motivating inclusion where equity, shared responsibility, self- and co-evaluation, critical historical awareness, protection and security, respect for diversity, identity, interculturality and solidarity prevail.

An example of the fulfillment of this model are the projects promoted by the Government of National Reconciliation and Unity (GRUN), which has created spaces for citizen participation, restoring the right to health, education and the promotion of equity.

He also highlighted some examples of genuine cooperation in Latin America, such as the Bolivarian Alliance for the Peoples of Our America - Peoples' Trade Agreement (ALBA-TCP), the National Literacy Crusade in 1980, the creation of the Normal School in Jalapa (at the end of the 1980s), the educational community councils, the School Lunch Program, among others.

People's Republic of China celebrates 74th anniversary of its founding in Nicaragua

The People's Republic of China celebrated in Managua the 74th anniversary of its founding with a reception attended by Nicaraguan government ministers, diplomatic corps and special guests.

Zhou Yi, acting chargé d'affaires of the Embassy of the People's Republic of China, on behalf of President Xi Jinping and the Chinese ambassador to Nicaragua, Chen Xi, said that they continue to strengthen coordination and collaboration in international and regional affairs.

"Over the course of 74 years, the Communist Party of China has united and led the Chinese people to make a great leap from a large, poor and populous Oriental country to become a modern-day socialist society. In this way China has caught up with the tide of the times by leaps and bounds and marched vigorously ahead of the times, entering a New Era under the firm leadership of the Party's Central Committee under Comrade Xi Jinping," said Yi.

"China firmly embraces an independent and peaceful foreign policy. We are dedicated to deepening and extending the global partnerships of equality, openness and cooperation. We adhere to the equality of all countries, whether large or small, respect the development path and social system sovereignly chosen by each people and resolutely oppose all manifestations of hegemony and politics of force. We categorically reject intervention by any foreign force in the affairs of other countries under any pretext whatsoever," he said.

M&R Consultores: Central Americans bet on integration and non-interference

M&R Consultores shared the results of the second Wave 2023 of the Panopticon of Public Opinion regarding the Independence of Central America, which reveals that 83.2% consider that the process of integration of the region should be supported.

Raúl Obregón, General Manager of M&R Consultores, pointed out that the survey shows that 62.6% of Central Americans and 63.3% of Nicaraguans agree that the indigenous peoples were victims of opprobrious atrocities and plundering by the Spanish conquistadors in 1521.

On this issue, 57.7% of Central Americans and 63.0% of Nicaraguans consider that the Spanish Monarchy should make a public apology to the original peoples (Indigenous) of Central America for having subjected them to opprobrious atrocities and looting of their property.

Obregón said that the results of the survey also indicate that 82.8% of Central Americans and 90.2% of Nicaraguans consider that the Independence was a success and has allowed us to develop according to our culture and interests.

Among the Central American countries, Nicaragua, with 97.7%, ranks as the country with the second highest knowledge of its national heroes.

Nicaragua participates in High-Level Meeting on Sustainable Tourism

During the session, the ACS Sustainable Tourism Work Program 2023-2024 was discussed, emphasizing the revitalization of the Caribbean sustainable tourism zone, smart destinations, digital transformation, air connectivity, competitiveness of MIPYMEs, among others.
